Plan2Dairy

Murray Dairy are partnering with other regional providers to offer Victorian dairy farmers Plan2Dairy as part of the Plan2Farm project.

Regional Development Victoria and the Department of Environment Land Water and Planning are funding up to 600 landowners in the Goulburn Murray Irrigation District to participate in the Plan2Farm program.

Plan2Farm is being delivered by the North Central Catchment Management Authority, Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority, North East Catchment Management Authority and Agriculture Victoria along with Murray Dairy. The delivery partners will case manage landowners through a process which can include one on one consultation with specialist consultants, facilitated group sessions and a workbook tailored to aid each farm business develop a robust plan for the future of their business.

Milk Quality Awards

Producers of top-quality milk have been recognised in the 2017 Australian Milk Quality Awards. The awards recognise farms across Australia in the lowest 5% of annual average bulk milk cell count (BMCC) and celebrate work done by farmers to keep milk quality at a consistently high standard. A low cell count is an indicator that mastitis is well controlled in the herd, improving milk production, cow health and welfare. Farmers achieving a low cell count are also financially rewarded with a premium for their milk and significant cost savings on mastitis treatments and labour. Data for the Dairy Australia Countdown Milk Quality Awards is supplied to Dairy Australia by dairy companies across the country and to be eligible, dairy farms must have data for a minimum of nine months in a calendar year.

Dairy farmer at Le Tour

Belgian dairy farmer Frederik Backaert is taking part in this year's Tour de France riding for the Wanty-Groupe Gobert team. Before he left for the race last Wednesday, Backaert milked 90 cows on the 38 hectare family farm at Brakel. The 27-year-old spends the mornings

training and the afternoons milking or cleaning machinery. After the fourth stage Backaert (race number 202) was in 175th position, 13 minutes 9 seconds behind the leader.

Update:

Dairy farmer at Le Tour

After the fifth stage, Belgian dairy farmer Frederik Backaert (race number 202) was in 164th position, 23 minutes 19 seconds behind the leader.
